### Racism, No Way!

Racism and racist behaviour are not tolerated in NSW public schools. Everyone in a NSW public school – learners, staff, parents, carers and community members – are expected to treat others fairly and with respect, and to behave in ways which do not promote racism in the school community.

If your child is experiencing racism at school, you should encourage them to report it to a teacher or the school's Anti-Racism Contact Officer (ARCO), Mrs Boyce, or you can report it on your child's behalf.

If you have experienced racism at school, you may make a complaint to the school. The Anti-Racism Contact Officer may provide you with assistance if you need it.

School-related racism that occurs online, such as students directing racist comments or statements towards individual students or cultural groups, should be reported to the school. Parents, carers and students can report such incidents to their year adviser, our Anti-Racism Contact Officer, or any member of staff.

### Bell Shakespeare

In Week 5 Mr Sam Crook travelled to Sydney to participate in the Bell Shakespeare National Mentorship Program.

Since 2007 Bell Shakespeare has engaged teachers from regional Australia in the Regional Teacher Mentorship, a four-day intensive professional learning program designed to equip teachers with innovative Shakespeare strategies, active learning principles, and teaching techniques to engage all learners across all year levels.

Only 30 teachers Australia-wide are chosen to be part of this program each year.

This is a wonderful achievement and we look forward to Mr Crook sharing his experience with us to reinvigorate the way we teach Shakespeare at GHS!
