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Celebrating Our School's Involvement in Agriculture, Music, Food Technology, Hospitality, Textiles and Technology Mandatory

Agriculture

Students in the school show team were involved at the Gulgong Show, showcasing the Poll Dorset x Aussie White sheep where they placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd in a variety of categories.

Year 8 Technology Mandatory have been growing pumpkins and corn which are soon to be harvested and watermelon that was harvested a few weeks ago. They were delicious. Year 8 students will also participate in the Henry Lawson Festival, by creating unique scarecrows for the event. Year 9 students attended a Youth Development Workshop at Mudgee Show, where they experienced drones, cattle, sheep and fire hazards skills from the Mid-Western fire brigade. Year 8 and Year 10 students have been working with steers and wethers down at the school farm, and Year 7 students enjoyed visiting and helping with maintenance. Year 11/12 Primary Industries students are attending a Farm Machinery Course early in Term 2.

Music

Music students have been busy too, with a Drumbeats performance at the Gulgong Show and at school assemblies. The school Band performed at the most recent assembly, showcasing their Rock music skills on guitar and drums. Noah Delaney and John Manatlao performed 'Nothing else matters' by Metallica and 'Everlong' by The Foo Fighters. Their performance was of an excellent standard and they should be proud of their efforts. More band performances are to come in future assemblies, featuring Year 7 students. Home Economics
